MAIKEN has been implementing consultations for testing, general medical, mental health care and psychology with experts on endemic diseases of Latin Americans in Japan. In reponse to the COVID-19 crisis, MAIKEN has been carrying out consultations from all over Japan via a hybrid system such as face-to-face and online interviews, and these experiences can be certainly leveraged to deliver mental health care to Ukrainian evacuees.

Presently, a serious shortage of Ukrainian interpreters in Japan has been an issue in supporting Ukrainian evecuees. In response to this, the Company decided to provide interpretation service collaborating with the call center for the mental health care consultation and medical consultation events which will be implemented by MAIKEN. The Company aims to assist in resolving problems such as health and mental anxiety that Ukrainian evecuees have, in order to give a support program to create a place where they can live with peace of mind.

This support program is available not only for Ukrainian evacuees and their related parties but also for the local governments, companies, organizations, etc., that have accepted or are planning to accept them.

The Company would like to express its heartfelt sympathy to those who are in a difficult situation

due to the prolonged situation in Ukraine. Through this support activity, the Company hopes that the "circle of support" for the people of Ukraine will expand, and that the peaceful days in which the people can spend their lives in peace will return as soon as possible.
